Climate Change and Labor: Challenges and Opportunities

How will the transition to a low-carbon economy affect union members?

SAN FRANCISCO, CA. February 12, 2018—On March 12, the League of Women Voters of Berkeley, Albany, and Emeryville; and three Bay Area chapters of the Citizens' Climate Lobby will host a forum that looks at the impacts of climate-related policy on unionized labor. The event begins at 6:30 PM at ILWU Local 34, 4 Berry Street, San Francisco (northeast of AT&T Park). Admission is free.

The transition to a low-carbon economy will not affect all workers equally. Some will see new job opportunities, some will be less affected, others will face job losses. A panel of 4 labor union representatives and 2 climate policy experts will discuss these effects, and examine policies and strategies that can best serve all workers, their families and communities.

A question and answer period will immediately follow the panel discussion. Attendees are encouraged to arrive at 6:30 to meet and mingle, and stay after the Q&A for follow-up conversations. Snacks and refreshments will be served.
